- Financial support of qualified library staffing, physical library facility, and quality knowledge based resources, both print and electronic.
- Encouragement of life long learning for health care professionals by supporting the utilization of available information resources.
- Inclusion of librarians on executive and managerial committees, work groups, and task forces that improve the quality of health care within the facility.
- Dedication to health information literacy, public access to information and expanded access to credible and authoritative information resources

This year the award is being presented to Barb Jahn, Vice President of Operations for Exempla Saint Joseph Hospital. The nomination states "Barb has shown in many ways that she understands and appreciates the value that librarians bring to the organization."

For example, Barb has made sure that the librarians are included in leadership meetings, retreats, and strategic planning sessions. Barb keeps us informed about the strategic plans of the hospital so that we can select and disseminate useful information to others in the organization.
